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Procedures	1. Print out pictures of a slave house, lower class home and

	2. Pass out the pictures to each student
	3. Have them cut out each house and glue them into their
	notebooks. Using one per page.
	4. Project the picture of the houses on the board.
	5. Have the students describe the houses in their own words.
	6. The teacher will make a list of all the descriptions for the
	students to write down into their journal.
	7. Discuss with the students that depending on the person's
	social status, the house will be constructed differently.
	8. Have them look at different houses- see if they can make the
	connection that wealthy families made their homes out of
	brick whereas poor families made their homes out of wood.
	See if they can make any other connections like amount of
	windows- how big are the windows- how many panes are in
	the windows. Also see if they talk about different roof styles
	and or construction materials of the roofs/walls/etc.
	9. Have the students categorize this information into their
	notebooks.
