

**Lesson Title:** Greek and Roman Architecture- Part One

<b>Lesson Components</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Virginia Standards of Learning (VSOL)</b>	3.1 The student will explain how the contributions of ancient Greece and Rome have influenced the present world in terms of architecture, government (direct and representative democracy), and sports.
<b>Objective</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To help students learn about the ancient Greek and Roman architecture and how their architecture influenced modern architecture.</li></ul>
<b>Assessment/Monitoring</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Informal- the students will have the opportunity to create their own columns.</li></ul>
<b>Procedures</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. The teacher will pass out a handout with the four types of columns: Doric, Ionic, Corinthian and Composite.</li><li>2. Have the students glue the handout into their journals.</li><li>3. Display the handout on the projector/doc cam.</li><li>4. Go over the four different types of columns with the students.</li><li>5. Then, show the class modern examples of Greek and Roman architecture and have them identify the columns found in modern architecture.</li></ol>
<b>Materials/Equipment/Preparation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Greek and Roman Columns handout</li><li>• Projector or doc cam</li></ul>
